"I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. 19 In a little while the world will no longer see Me, but you will see Me; because I live, you also will live. ²⁰ On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in Me, and I in you. ²¹ They who have My commandments and keep them are those who love Me, and those who love Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love them and reveal Myself to them." ²² Judas (not Iscariot) said to Him, "Lord, how is it that You will reveal Yourself to us and not to the world?" ²³ Jesus answered him, "Those who love Me will keep My word, and My Father will love them, and We will come to them and make Our home with them. ²⁴ Whoever does not love Me does not keep My words, and the word that you hear is not Mine but is from the Father who sent Me. ²⁵ "I have said these things to you while I am still with you. ²⁶ But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you. ²⁷ Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you. 
