John 1:1–5, 10 – 14 (NRSV)

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things came into being through Him, and without Him not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴ in Him was life, and the life was the light of all people. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world came into being through Him, yet the world did not know Him. ¹¹ He came to what was His own, and His own people did not accept Him. ¹² But to all who received Him, who believed in His name, He gave power to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen His glory, the glory as of a father's only Son, full of grace and truth.
